## Plan For Many Adventures While In Red Rock Country...

The red rock country of the Moab area offers unlimited recreational opportunities. Below are listed just a few. Check with the local businesses and tour operators listed in this brochure for additional details on services they provide.

### Four-Wheeling

For many Moab visitors, a favorite way to explore the backcountry is by four-wheel drive vehicles. The countryside is laced with roads built by miners and ranchers constructed just well enough to allow passage. The national and state parks have four-wheel drive roads, but your visit might well include many other exciting places found on Bureau of Land Management or Forest Service lands. Tour operators offer a range of guided trips, or you may rent a vehicle from one of the listed agencies and explore on your own. Either way, you'll see canyon country from a vantage not available unless you are four-wheeling.

### Cycling

Pedal your way through some of the best cycling country in the world. Trails and roads through slick-rock, mountains, and deserts attract road riders and mountain-biking enthusiasts of all ages and experience levels. Trails such as Moab Slickrock, White Rim, and Kokopelli challenge experienced riders. Other trails and roads wind through red rock country offering a wide diversity of rides ranging from multi-day to half-day trips. You can cycle throughout most of the year with the spring and fall offering particularly wonderful conditions.

### Snow-based Activities

Winter in the La Sal and Bookcliff Mountains allows for traditional snow based sports. In the La Sals, Utah's second highest mountain range, cross country skiing dominates the activity list. Take your choice of professionally guided tours or self-guided trips. You can even arrange to stay in a backcountry cabin overnight. Groomed trails are maintained and rental equipment is available. Snowcat touring, snowmobiling and tubing add to the enjoyment of winter's visitors.

### Equestrian

Equestrian events and horseback rides are spectacular in the red rock country surrounding Moab. Rodeos, team roping, and horse shows offer opportunities to participate or be a spectator in local equestrian activities. Annual trail rides take you through "wild west" terrain and allow you to spend a night under the stars. Operators provide a range of trips, some at hourly rates while others are multi-day excursions into more remote backcountry. Short-term stabling facilities are available for those traveling with their own horses at Spanish Trail Arena (435-259-6226 or fax 435-259-7916).

### River running / Boat tours

The Colorado and Green Rivers offer a myriad of opportunities for the water enthusiast. Cataract Canyon and Westwater are among the whitewater challenges for which the area is famous. Flat or calm water allow for different types of activities such as canoeing or kayaking. You can float down a river under heat of the day or in the evening while watching a sunset. Oar powered paddle, motorized raft, or jet boat are all used on the rivers with trips running from a few hours to a few days.

### Hiking

The Moab area is blessed with a variety of scenic well-established hiking trails. It is possible to start from the center of Moab and take a number of fun short hikes. A few minutes drive in any direction will put you at a trailhead of your choosing or on the doorstep of a tour operator to guide you through pristine canyons. Hike to the top of the Moab Rim along Hidden Valley Trail for a panoramic view, in the cool aspen forests of the La Sal's or along Mill Creek Canyon to discover an ancient petroglyph or play in shady swimming holes.

### Hunting and Fishing

The outdoorsman seeking excellent elk or deer hunting can look to the La Sal Mountains. Antelope are taken near Cisco while north of Moab one can find good areas for chukar hunting. The Bookcliffs provide other areas to hunt several wildlife species. Catfish are taken in the rivers while mountain lakes in the La Sals are stocked with trout. Those interested in the harvesting of wildlife resources should check with local authorities for information on licenses, seasons, locations and bag limits. Licenses and equipment may be obtained from several local vendors. Limited guide service is available.
